

Minutes of the 28th Meeting of the Academic Council

- ❖ Principal sought approval and confirmation of the minutes of the last meeting of the Academic council which was held on 13th February 2023. It was accepted and approved.
- ❖ The members appreciated the institution for the achievement of 4th rank in NIRF ranking.

ITEMS

- I To approve and consider the introduction of new programmes Master of Social work (MSW), M.Sc Fashion & Apparel Design and M.Sc Applied Psychology from the academic year 2023-24 and onwards.
 - The resolution was passed. It was seconded and approved by Dr. N. Ponpandian, Professor & Head, Department of Nanoscience and Technology, Bharathiar University and also by Dr. R. Rajendran, Associate Professor, Department of Microbiology, PSG College of Arts and Science, Coimbatore.
- II To approve the changes in the scheme of examinations, question paper pattern and evaluation for both UG and PG programmes (excl.MBA) from the academic year 2023-24 and onwards.

- ❖ He also enquired about the innovative practices in the evaluation system. Open book system, 100 percent internal marks and credit transfer of study abroad programs were explained.

- ❖ She also said that the JOC on GST and E-filing has helped them to a great extent to equip with practical knowledge and to choose their career path.
- ❖ Ms. Sakthiha Sri V of II B.Sc CS with Cognitive Systems felt that the curriculum is designed in such a way that it focusses on developing skills like logical thinking, critical thinking and design thinking among the students.
- ❖ She further added that the MoUs with industries of different domains like KCW- Elgi equipments Coimbatore DOJO Center, academic alliance with Uipath, automation anywhere and ICT Academy keeps them abreast with the latest technological trends.
