

- The inspection commission visit for these programmes are scheduled from 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> September and concerned departments to be ready with all details.
- ❖ Student induction programme for the I UG students will begin on 16<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2021 in the online mode.
- ❖ Faculty Induction Programme to be organized for the newly recruited faculty
- Student Quality Cell meeting to be conducted
- Need based faculty development programmes, awareness programmes and workshops to be organised
- ❖ ISO Internal Audit, MRM and Surveillance audit to be conducted for the academic year 2020-21.
- ❖ We shall follow the 50/50 marks pattern (Internal 50 Marks and External- 50 marks) in assessments as per Bharathiar University norms. This shall be effective from 2021 batch onwards. English Paper-I and Introduction to Entrepreneur development courses are revamped in Semester I.
- ❖ Changes in curriculum to be made on par with industry 4.0. Bharathiar University has framed a standard syllabus for Industry 4.0. The University has suggested a list of courses to be included in the curriculum
- ❖ A course on Design Thinking across disciplines to be introduced for 30 hours
- ❖ It is suggested that a course on NCC with 12 credits can be introduced as an option for Skill Based Course in the II & III years for NCC students.
  - ❖ The Board of studies meetings are to be organized online and the syllabi and curriculum revamped in tune with the NEP. The Curriculum for the 2021-22 batch is to be designed using the Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) at both the undergraduate and post-graduate levels.

#### ACTION TAKEN REPORT

- ❖ The Student Induction Programme for the first-year students was conducted for three days virtually on 16.09.2021, 17.09.2021 & 20.09.2021. The departments were clubbed into eight groups to effectively handle the induction programme through online mode.
- ❖ Faculty Induction Programme for the newly recruited faculty was conducted for two days on 05.10.2021 and 06.10.2021 in the Conference Hall.
- ❖ FDP on Introduction to Entrepreneurship was jointly organized by the IQAC and Entrepreneurship Development cell on September 28, 2021. Dr.Savitha Nair, Associate Professor, GRG School of Management Studies was the resource person.
- ❖ Students Quality Cell meeting was conducted on 20-11-2021 in the IQAC office to solicit suggestions related to curriculum, teaching and learning and infrastructure from students and to register their grievances. The minutes of the meeting were briefed to the Principal and the departments concerned and corrective measures were taken.
- ❖ Workshop on Curriculum Design was conducted on 17-11-2021. 75 Faculty members benefitted by the workshop.
  - ❖ Virtual interaction on Future Skills was held on 15-11-2021.110 Faculty members benefitted.
  - ❖ Awareness programme to students on Social Media Crimes against Women and Children was organized on 26-10-2021. 154 students benefitted.
  - ❖ IQAC in association with Indian Medical Association, Coimbatore Branch Women Doctors Wing, organized Swayam Programme Awareness on Breast and Cervical Cancer for our students on 13-10-2021 .180 students benefitted.
  - Mentored Saraswathi Thiayagaraja College, Pollachi, VLB College of Art and Science and Sri Krishna Adithya College of Arts and Science for NAAC appraisal.

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

#### MINUTES OF THE IQAC GENERAL BODY MEETING

The IQAC general body meeting was convened on 17.03.2022. Our Chairperson Dr. R.Nandini welcomed the external experts and the internal members through the online platform. She appreciated the IQAC team for their tireless efforts which has elevated the

Principal Dr.S.Nirmala gave the introductory note. She appreciated the quality enhancement activities initiated by the IQAC which led the college to NAAC 'A++' Grade and 6<sup>th</sup> rank in NIRF. The higher education scenario is set to change as NEP will be implemented shortly. This meeting is convened to strengthen the institution to face the challenges.

#### **Suggestions given by the External Members**

#### Dr. Partha S Mallick

- Future goals of the institution are to be framed but implementation of institutional plans will be a challenging task. The college has to develop strategic plans to implement these ideas and reviewed periodically.
- Student diversity should be improved. Quality of higher education rendered should attract students from other states and other countries.
- Quality of the institution is based on the quality of the teachers. Retention of the faculty is important. Promote teachers to aspire more. Establish quality culture in the college so that the college will go to the next level. Research aptitude of the teachers to be improved, management can give awards to faculty members with good research output. 50% of teachers should have funded projects. Student-teacher ratio should be appropriate. Management can give fellowships to attract good research scholars.
- Regarding product based research implementation and commercialisation of patents would be a challenging task.

#### Dr N. Ponpandian

- LOCF is implemented in the curriculum. Syllabus should be periodically revised to
  include the latest updates. The curriculum to be revised based on questionnaire type
  feedback. In future descriptive type feedback of the students should also be analysed
  to improve the syllabus.
- Faculty to prepare SWAYAM and MOOC courses.
- Strategies should be devised for attaining short term and long term goals.

#### Mr. P. S. Ramachandran

- He stated that diversity of women moving up in the professional ladder is less though opportunities are plenty in the industry and MNCs.
- Changing the mind-set of the students is very important. Educating parents about women empowerment is important. Faculty to address both the parents and teachers about the opportunities available.
- Guest lectures could be arranged with experts from the industry as resource persons.
   Career guidance should be provided to students.
- Enhancing communication skills of the students is very important
- Collaborating with industries is essential.
- Students should be oriented to get into corporate sector
- Certification from other institutions can be made as part of the curriculum
- Skill-sets of the students to be improved
