PSGR Krishnammal College for Women (KCW) was established in 1963 under the auspices of the GRG Trust. With the motto 'Empowering Women through Education', KCW has established itself as a leader in women's education over a span of six decades.

KCW is an autonomous institution, affiliated to Bharathiar University, Coimbatore. It is ranked #9 among colleges in the country in 2025 by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The college is accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with A++ grade (score of 3.71 out of 4). KCW is also a certified 'College of Excellence' by the University Grants Commission (UGC) of the Government of India.

KCW is home to 8,500+ students and 425+ faculty members. The College offers 39 Undergraduate, 19 Postgraduate, 1PG Diploma, 2 Diploma and 15 Doctoral Programmes in Arts & Humanities, Natural & Physical Sciences, Computational Sciences, Commerce & Business, Management and Vocational Studies.

KCW has established international collaborative partnerships with premier universities and institutions around the world. All Eight Science departments have been awarded the 'Star Status' by DBT. Interdisciplinary Science research is promoted through the DST FIST, DBT-BUILDER and DST-CURIE programme. The GRG BIRAC EYUVA Centre (Encouraging Youth for Undertaking Innovative Research through Vibrant Acceleration) has been established with the support of BIRAC (Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council).

The College has been recognised as a Nodal Training Institute under the Agri-Clinics & Agri-Business Centres (ACABC) programme launched by 'MANAGE' in association with NABARD under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Government of India.

A Rural Women Technology Park (DST-sponsored) has been launched to empower women in rural areas through technology transfer and entrepreneurship. Thus, the college keeps progressing towards excellence.

JOB ORIENTED COURSES

B.Voc. DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Vocational or skill-based education is becoming more and more significant in the present scenario. B.Voc (Bachelor of Vocation) is an emerging course in India that aims at providing adequate skills required for a particular trade to candidates. The course is different from traditional academic programmes as it deals more with skill-based studies rather than focusing on only theoretical knowledge.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skills development based higher education as part of college/university education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree with multiple exits such as Diploma/Advanced Diploma under the National Skill Qualification Frame work (NSQF). The B.Voc. Programme is focused on universities and colleges providing undergraduate studies which would also incorporate specific job roles and their National Occupational Standards (NOSs) along with broad general education. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc. to make a meaningful participation in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge. The College has taken a new skill development initiative in the year 2014-2015 by introducing B.Voc. degree programme.

CHANDRAKANTHI CENTRE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND EXCELLENCE

Skill Enhancement Programme

The skill enhancement programme is designed for all the UG and PG students to equip them with expert knowledge, professionalism and develop their personality along with the academic skills to make them ready for the professional future and meet out the Industry expectations.

UG First Year

Linguaskill is a computer-based language assessment test offered by Cambridge Assessment English. The test is designed to evaluate the language proficiency of non-native English speakers in a variety of contexts, including academic and general communication, in all four language skills - speaking, writing, reading and listening. Results are aligned to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), the international standard for describing language ability. This course will be offered to all I year students. Trained faculty and British Council certified trainers will handle the classes.

PG First Year & UG Second Year - 36 Hours

General Aptitude for Campus placement is given for the entire UG second-year and PG first-year students. The course covers Quantitative Aptitude, Logical Reasoning and Verbal Aptitude. Corporate trainers from various companies' train the students. Student Support Manual- 'Career Catalyst' by Pearson has been prepared and distributed to the students.

PG Second Year & UG Third Year - 36 Hours

Soft skill for Campus Placement is given for the entire UG third-year and PG second-year students. The course covers Resume Writing, Group Discussion, Grooming, Body Language, Communication, Time Management, Leadership Skills and Interview Skills. Corporate trainers from various companies' train the students. Student Support Manual- 'Career Catalyst' by Pearson has been prepared and distributed to the students.

Campus to Corporate Connect

Placement registered students undergo this Industry readiness program wherein experts from industry provide training to the students on interview.

CENTRE FOR E-RESOURCES

The centre aims at high-quality plan of the whole instructional approach of the various programmes offered in the college in tune with National Programme on Technology Education Learning. The e-contents with combination of sounds, images and text prepared by our faculty members provide free online video lectures in science and humanity courses and are made available in learning management portal 24x7 to our students.

LANGUAGE LAB

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women established the Language Lab in the year 2008, which is a language training platform to maximize practical learning of language and language-oriented skills. Lady Hawk software is installed in the lab to expand activity based learning amidst first and second year students of under graduation. Every year, around 3500 students get benefitted by getting trained through the language software to learn various languages like English, French and German. Language Lab allows students to practice language with a much wider variety of activities and exercises using online modules. Different modes of activities like audio exercises, video exercises and audio-visual materials are programmed to equip the users. The students watch videos, practice their pronunciation through a speech recognizer, learn new vocabulary and work out the grammatical tasks and they can also have a record of their scores. The platform is tailored to the individual needs of students. On the other hand, the monitoring and evaluation pattern are incorporated into the system and the teacher can identify the areas of difficulties students encounter during the course of language learning process.

GRG BIRAC E-YUVA CENTRE

GRG BIRAC E-YUVA Centre, supported by Biotechnology Industrial Research Assistance Council, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, is established to promote entrepreneurial innovation among young students and researchers. In its first batch, the Centre hosted 3 Postdoctoral Innovation Fellows and 25 Undergraduate E-YUVA Fellows, who worked on bio-startups and patent-oriented projects in the areas of enzyme technology, waste valorization, healthcare, and food technology, having 4 patents and 3 startups as outcome. Recognizing the Centre's impact, BIRAC has extended its tenure until 2026. The Centre has also successfully onboarded the second batch of 24 E-YUVA and 3 Innovation Fellows working on Healthy sanitary napkins, food packing material from flower waste, AI based nano-motion

detection, Biodegradable plastic from fish waste, wound healing patches, Synbiotic milk, hydrogel matrix for diabetic wounds and industrial chemical biosynthesis respectively.

The primary objective of the GRG BIRAC E-YUVA Centre is to foster a culture of research, innovation, and capacity building at the undergraduate level in academic institutions, while simultaneously creating opportunities and access in the field of life science entrepreneurship.

DBT-BUILDER (Level-1)

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women has been sanctioned with a grant of Rs.1.2 crores to establish **DBT-BUILDER – PSGR Krishnammal College for Women - Interdisciplinary Life Science Programme for Advance Research and Education** under the “Boost to University Interdisciplinary Life science Departments for Education and Research (BUILDER – Level-1)” Programme for advanced research and education by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India. The DBT - BUILDER grant will be utilised to promote interdisciplinary teaching and research in Plant derived exosomes as effective drug delivery system. The funding supports Enhancement of Infrastructure and Human Resources. The DBT-BUILDER augmented infrastructure facilities will immensely benefit masters and research students and facilitate high-end research, enhance the skill sets of student, teaching learning process and interdisciplinary research and help empower women in the field of life sciences.

DST FIST PG Colleges (Level A)

PSGRKCW has been sanctioned with a grant of Rs.57 lakhs by DST FIST, New Delhi, under PG Colleges (Level A) in the year 2023, aiming towards augmentation of infrastructure and research facilities. The fund supports modernization of laboratories through acquisition of sophisticated equipment, activities pertaining to Industrial and Research Development/Scientific Social Responsibilities. These facilities will immensely benefit Masters and Research Scholars via organizing workshops, awareness programmes, facilitating high end research in new and emerging areas of PG Science Departments of the institution. In addition, FIST support aids extension of equipment utility service to industries through analysis of samples. Inclusive assistance by DST FIST will proliferate the premier status of KCW to cutting-edge level of competency.

DST CURIE-PG

KCW has been granted the prestigious DST CURIE-PG 2023 grant for a period of three years. The eight participating Post graduation Science departments that include Departments of Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Data Analytics, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology will benefit from the grant. The grant will help to further strengthen our existing science infrastructure and networking, to cater to the benefit of academia and enhance interdisciplinary research and industry - academia relationship.

CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE FOR COMMERCE PROFESSIONALS

The centre of Excellence for Commerce Professionals (CECP) was inaugurated by Shri. T. Mano Thangaraj, then Honourable Minister for IT and Digital Services, Tamilnadu. The event took place on 11 November 2022, during the conclave of Professional Practices. CECP aims to significantly impact aspiring professionals. It offers programs like CA, ACS, CMA, ACCA and USCMA, along with industry readiness courses and a research centre. The Centre includes skilled individuals, professional experts and experienced alumni. They are highly competent in transforming students into successful professionals.

CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE IN LIFE SCIENCES

The Centre of Excellence in Life Sciences is committed to provide the highest quality education and training to the next generation of life scientists. Our educational programmes are designed to equip students with the knowledge, skills and expertise needed to tackle the pressing challenges faced by the society today. The Centre of Excellence in Life Sciences is equipped with state-of-the-art infrastructure to support cutting-edge research and innovation in the field of life sciences. Our facilities include advanced laboratory equipment, high-performance computational biology and biotechnology lab. The centre takes pride in providing an excellent eco system to facilitate advanced research in the areas of life science.

CENTRE FOR ADVANCED MATERIALS AND SUSTAINABLE TECHNOLOGIES (CAMAST)

The Centre for Advanced Materials and Sustainable Technologies (CAMAST) is established in honour of our founder Smt.Chandrakanthi's birth cenetenary. It has four divisions such as Energy Materials and Technologies

(EMT), Environmental Materials and Sustainability (EMS), Health and Sensing Technologies (HST) and Cross-cutting Initiatives (CCI). Each division is intended to provide expert knowledge that will help identify potential research areas. CAMAST focuses on sustainable innovation and research that directly benefits society. It aims to bridge the gap between academia and industry through impactful partnerships.

CHANDRAKANTHI CENTRE FOR WOMEN LEADERSHIP

The Chandrakanthi Centre for Women Leadership (CCWL) at GRG School of Management studies honours Smt. G.Chandrakanthi, the Founder Trustee of the GRG Trust. Inspired by her dedication to women's empowerment through education, the centre aims to shape the future of women from various backgrounds. CCWL addresses the gap in female leadership in organisations and society. It offers training, awareness programs, Skill-building initiatives, coaching, mentorship and high level events. By partnering with national and international organizations, it promotes inclusivity, gender equality and empowerment. CCWL aims to create a more equitable and diverse society where women lead with confidence and purpose.

AMHSSC CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE FOR APPAREL, MADE-UPS AND HOME FURNISHING

An MOU with AMHSSC, Delhi was signed on 11 September 2023 in the presence of Padma Shri Dr. A. Sakthivel, Chairman, AMHSSC, Delhi, to facilitate collaborative work. The AMHSSC Centre of Excellence for Apparel, Made-ups and Home Furnishing, PSGRKCW, was inaugurated on 9 March 2024 by Shri Atul Kumar Tiwari, IAS, Secretary, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India, New Delhi. Padma Shri Dr. A. Sakthivel felicitated the gathering. A sum of Rs.1.5 crore rupees has been sanctioned for related machinery and equipment.

The Centre of Excellence houses three sectors namely the Design Centre with UK based GEMINI 2D and 3D Apparel Designing software for design development; Prototype Development Centre which is a miniature industrial setup for prototype development and is equipped with all the necessary machines from cutting to packing and the Skill Development Centre which facilitates skill training and enhancement. The main objectives of the COE are skill development for students and society through short term and certificate

programs, research and market analysis, student and industry projects, NSDC assessments, training of trainers and other programs in collaboration with AMHSSC, New Delhi. Programs and workshops have been planned in the near future to enhance the skills of the students to make them industry ready and to encourage startups. 11 skill development programmes were conducted for the year 2024 - 2025 and 335+ participants have been skilled and are industry ready.

CENTRE FOR INNOVATION, INCUBATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (CIED)

The CIED has five subdivisions, each division operates with specific objectives as follows

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell conducts Entrepreneurship Awareness Camps, Faculty Development Programmes, Industry visits, Ideation Workshops, and Boot camps. Every year, around 3,500 students get exposure through ED activities. IgniteX-an entrepreneurship course with Generative AI, in collaboration with the Wadhvani Foundation, is introduced to transform interested KCW students into successful entrepreneurs.

MoE-Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) conducts Product Expos, Idea contests, National and International hackathons, and business plan competitions for over 750 students to spot talents, mentor and train them to enable venture creation. The institution was awarded a 4-star status during 2024-25 for the successful conduct of activities. Our IIC is mentoring three non-performing IIC institutions and 3 Atal Tinkering Laboratories in schools.

Campus companies namely, Magical Shades and Vogue and Style operate within the campus, managed successfully by student entrepreneurs, and mentored by faculty.

The Incubation and Start-up Centre facilitates the launch of start-ups by aspiring students and young women in the community. Two student startups, namely “Yarn Loop” and “Purple Studio” and one faculty startup of “Biowraps”, were created in the academic year 2024-25.

Rural Women Technology Park (RWTP) aims to empower women in rural areas through technology transfer and entrepreneurship. Over 4500 rural women have benefited from this initiative.

SKILL SATELLITE CENTRE

The Skill satellite centre project, funded under Technology Development and Utilization Programme for Women (TDUPW)/A2K+ scheme of DSIR, is implemented by KCW in RWTP, Pillayapampalayam Village, Annur. A physical infrastructure of about 3400 sq.ft. on 1 acre is being created by the institution to develop technologies like solar dehydration, extruded technology, resistant starch preparation from raw banana, fortification and value addition which are mainly cultivated in the surrounding rural areas. This initiative of KCW is committed to working towards gender parity and making women's work visible at all levels of development.

The GRG - ELGI innovation DOJO is an innovative initiative aimed at providing students with a unique learning experience that combines theoretical knowledge in technology (AI/ML, Power BI, DS) with practical exposure to industry practices and methods. This initiative is a result of the long standing partnership between our institution and ELGi and marks a new dimension in our industry-academia collaboration.

Rules of Admission / Withdrawal

1. Candidates for admission to the degree class should have passed the XII Standard or Pre-Degree examination or its equivalent declared eligible by the Bharathiar University for admission to the degree course.
2. Students who are found to have obtained admission by false representations will be dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
3. No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fee due from her has been paid.
4. A student admitted after the beginning of a term should pay the whole fees for the term even if she has paid the fees in some other college, and it is left to the discretion of the principal to extend any concession in deserving cases.
5. If a student discontinues her study, a transfer certificate will be issued on request, with a payment of ₹ 5, provided, she applies for the same not later than the fifth working day of the succeeding term after leaving the college.
6. If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year, she is entitled to receive the attendance certificate required by the university if she applies for it.

Rules of Discipline

1. Students should not use cell phones during class hours.
2. Day scholars using two wheelers should wear helmet, failing which they will not be permitted to park their vehicles inside the campus.
3. Students are directed to look up the notice boards every day.
4. Scribbling on the walls, desks or any other kind of damage to college property is strictly prohibited. Students responsible for such damages will be severely punished.
5. Students are advised to avoid usage of Plastic products inside campus.
6. Clean & hygienic practices and conservation of water should be strictly followed by the students.
7. The campus is under CCTV surveillance and the movements of students are monitored.

Rules of Attendance

1. No student may absent herself from the college without proper reasons. Application for leave must be handed over to the Principal and it should be counter signed by the HOD concerned. When the absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted as early as possible, and in no case later than the first day of return to the college. The leave applied for, in time will ordinarily be granted when proper reasons are given but in case of sickness extending for more than three days, submission of a medical certificate is obligatory.
2. If a student absents herself for a week without submitting a leave application, her name may be struck off in the rolls unless she shows that her failure to obtain leave was unavoidable.
3. A student who is absent for any part of the morning/afternoon session will be considered absent for half-a-day unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence.
4. One day absence without leave letter will be considered as two days of absence unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence and grants leave.
5. 75% attendance for each course paper is the minimum eligibility to appear for the End Semester Examinations.
6. A candidate who has lack of attendance (65% - 75%) can apply for condonation only once during their period of study.
7. A candidate who has secured less than 65% of attendance in any Semester will not be permitted to take the regular examinations.
8. Each Student has to select an extra-curricular activity - Physical Education / NCC / NSS / YUVA / YRC / Rotaract / EcoWatch / Yoga Club / e-cell, Quiz Club / Consumer Club / Gender Championship Club / Uyir Club / Health Care / WBCC.
9. Terminal examination will ordinarily be held at the end of each semester. Except for very special cases, students will not be allowed to absent themselves for these examinations. One Continuous Assessment (CA) test and a Model Examination will be conducted for each course in every semester. Tentative dates are provided in the calendar. Students' reports will be available at the end of every semester in our college website.

GRG Centenary Sports Arena is located near the Eastern Gate of PSGR Krishnammal College for Women, Coimbatore. It is exclusively for the indoor games and fitness gymnasium. It includes a classy synthetic court for Volleyball, Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess, Carrom and Basketball with electronic score boards.

The centenary sports arena ceiling is now packed up into a work of Art with a custom-covered hanging ceiling baffle to stop the echo. Entire arena is hung up with resin- hardened, acoustic baffles that give an excellent ceiling sound proofing for the clear audio visualization. It also includes the Hi-tech equipments for the first aid section. The Indoor games equipments were imported from the USA in high quality including safety measures. It is equipped with a 1500 seating gallery for audience. It also has the comforts of an Air-conditioned VIP room with attached pantry. There are convenient rest rooms with lockers separately for Team I, Team II, Ladies Spectators and for Gents Spectators. Special highlighted features inside the convenience are the provision given to physically challenged person's restroom. The Sports Arena includes a warehouse to store the sports equipment and materials. Unfurnished Dormitory is available for the outstation teams to provide accommodation during tournaments. Latest electronic scoring board is available for Basketball game to conduct tournaments. The Arena has a CCTV (Closed Circuit Television) system in which signals are not publicly distributed but are monitored, primarily for surveillance and security purposes.

GRG PURPLE HUES FITNESS STUDIO

The GRG Purple Hues Fitness Studio upholds the universal truth that health is wealth. It houses two gymnasium halls, with fully ultra-modern comprehensive range of weights and cardio vascular training equipments such as TreadMill, Cross trainer, Stair Climber, Motorized Cycling, Abs Crunch,

Spin Bike, Rowing Boat, Stretching Machine and Strength Training Machine, Multi Press Machine, Smith Machine, Adductor and Abductor Machine, Pectoral Fly, Leg Press, Kettle Bell, Swiss Ball and Dumbbells on an outlay of eighty lakhs. Activities such as Weight Reduction Program, Weight Management Program have been given by fitness experts to the registered students and faculties to maintain fitness and health.

Our college is accredited by the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants of India for conducting coaching classes for CMA Foundation and Intermediate from the academic year 2012-13. The classes for Self-Financing students are scheduled from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm on all week days and from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm for aided students.

ACCA

Aided and Self Finance Programmes in B.Com. stream except B.Com. (PA) is accredited with Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), UK. All the courses under B.Com. stream except B.Com. (PA) are

integrated with ACCA. B.Com (A&F) students will get exemption up to 9 ACCA papers where they need to pass only 4 papers and all other B.Com. stream students will get exemption up to 6 papers where they need to pass only 7 papers to qualify the same. Classes are conducted in PSGRKCW campus. 100% placement support for qualifying students. The qualified students can hold an advisory role in the field of Tax, Audit, Accounting and Finance.

REMEDIAL COACHING SCHEME

UGC sponsored remedial coaching at undergraduate and postgraduate level for (i) SC/ST students and (ii) students belonging to minority communities is provided mainly to improve the academic skills, linguistic proficiency and level of comprehension.

RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT CELL

The institution takes pride and pleasure in publishing peer-reviewed, registered quarterly journal "Advances in Applied Research" since June 2009, bearing the International Standard Serial Number (ISSN) 0974 - 3839 (Print ISSN) and 2349-2104 (Online ISSN) for the sixteenth year in succession. The National Academy of Agricultural Sciences (NAAS) rating for our journal is 3.59.

GRG Hostel

The hostel is situated nearly 2 kilometers away from the college. It accommodates more than 2000 members inclusive of additional hostels (students & teachers). The hostel is under the direct control of the Secretary who is its Chief Warden. She is vested with powers to interpret and enforce the rules and is assisted by a warden. The warden guides the deputy wardens and matrons to manage the day-to-day administration.

Hostel Rules

1. Students are not allowed to go out of the hostel without the written permission of the warden.
2. No student shall stay outside the hostel for the night without the written permission from the parent or guardian.
3. Students are permitted to go home only on 'General Permission' declared twice a month. Students must return to the hostel on Sundays before 6.00 pm.
4. Hostel students shall not absent themselves from the college without informing the warden and duly signed the leave register which is at all the hostels.
5. Visitors are permitted to meet the inmates on Saturdays, Sundays and National holidays between 09.00 am to 5.30 pm. Visitors must register their name and furnish relevant details in the visitors register.
6. Members shall not disturb others and shall in no way interfere with the work of other inmates.
7. Students should switch off their room lights by 10.30 pm. They can make use of study hall after that if needed.
8. Misconduct or breach of hostel rules renders the offender liable to fine or suspension or dismissal from both the hostel and college.
9. Members shall not issue any order to the hostel servants and shall not interfere with their work.
10. Misbehavior on the part of the servants and residents shall be reported to the deputy warden immediately with all particulars. The members are not permitted to take any direct measures.

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11. Members of the hostel who want to leave the hostel must give a written notice of their intention at least a week before the date of leaving except on emergency.
 12. Students are not allowed to go out for any reason after punching the attendance.
 13. Day scholars taking food without token should pay Rs. 500/- as fine. The hosteler accompanying the day scholar involved in such incident should also pay Rs.500/- as fine.
 14. The students must enter the details in the outgoing register while going out of the campus.
 15. Wards are instructed to fill up "IN" time only after returning from the outings.
 16. Cell phones are permitted only inside the rooms and not in common areas.
 17. Students are instructed to punch the attendance before going out in case of general permission and special permission.
 18. Students who are vacating in between should pay the administrative charges of the remaining months for that academic year.
 19. Students are required to stay in the allotted rooms, if any student found staying in different rooms without any prior permission they will be subject to disciplinary action as per the hostel administration's decision.
 20. Students are advised to get prior permission from the HOI/HOD/ Warden to go out from the college for reasons such as industry visit, project work, extra classes, sponsorship, etc.
 21. Students who are taking leave for more than five days with permission will be eligible to get mess reduction. But they should pay the administration charges for the entire leave period.
 22. Hostellers who come to attend classes as day scholars under any circumstances, are not eligible for mess fee reduction.
